

“a blank check”:	Germany tells Austria that they will back them up no matter what happens with Serbia.
“dropping the pilot”:	Keiser William II fires Bismark, and gets rid of all of his policies
“spark that lit the powder keg”:	Assination of Archduke Francis Ferdinand by Serbian terrorists.
100 days:	After escaping from Elba, Napoleon goes back to France to rule for a hundred days
Alexander II:	The reforming Czar, freed the serfs, created local governments, but didn't touch the autocracy
Anarchism:	Destroy the government by randomly assassinating authority figures
Anarchists:	Most famous were Pierre Proudhon (property is theft), Michael Bakunin (workers rise up and destroy the government)
Ballot Act of 1873:	Parliament gets a secret vote
Berstein, Edward:	Socialist displaced by Bismark's anti-socialist legislation, but later elected to the Reichstag from 1902-1918.
Bismark:	Chancellor of the German Empire, and unifier of Germany
Bloody June Days:	Class warfare in France, Monarchists win out
Bobbies:	police force in England
Boulangier:	Crazy bastard thought he'd set up a war of revenge on Germany, but quickly decided to flee the country and commit suicide instead
Brains of Italian Unification:	Cavour, Prime minister of Sardinia, plans to unify northern Italy through alliance with Napoleon III.
Canning;	Of the team Peel & Canning, they were responsible for most of the reforms during early 19 th century: Free trade, repealed the Test Act, established the Bobbies
Carbonari:	Underground Nationalist Italian unification Group
Carlsbad Decrees:	After a member of a student association for a unified Germany killed a member of government, these decrees banned these (Bsuikihchsek;atL Clubs) student associations
Charles X:	King of France until he abdicated during the French Revolution of 1830, as Illustrated in <i>Liberty Leading Her People</i>
Church of Madeline:	Neo-Classical architecture
Clemenceau:	France's voice during the Treaty of Versailles; wants to punish Germany; The Tiger... Rawr...
Colonel Rhodes:	Built Roads in Germany... It's punny... haha...
Comte:	French Nobility
Concert of Europe:	Headed by Metternich of Austria, it was set up after Napoleon was exiled to defeat any Nationalist Revolts
Concordat of 1801:	Napoleon's attempt to appease the pope by letting the Catholic Church remain important

Congress of Berlin:	Held in Germany (The “Satisfied Power”), they decided the fate of the Balkan’s after the Russo-Turkish war.
Congress of Vienna:	Held to decide the fate of Europe after being run by Napoleon for a couple of decades, created the concert of Europe
Continental System:	Decree declaring that the European Continent, currently under Napoleon’s power, could not trade with England
Corn Laws:	Tax placed on corn, and grain products to keep the price artificially high to supplement the income of the manufacturers. Repealed under Peel and Canning, partially due to the Potato Famine
Count Saint Simon:	French Utopian Socialist, influenced Marx
Crimean War:	Religious dispute in the Ottoman empire, that Russia jumped into (you guessed it) to get Constantinople. Destroys the Concert of Europe, opens the door for Italian and German Unification
Cubism:	Art form inspired by Einstein’s 4D universe, attempts to show multiple perspectives, and occasionally time passing in a single image
Decembrest Revolt:	Poor dumb serfs attempting to get “Constantine or Constitution” on the throne in early 1800’s. (Serf’s are so incredible stupid they think that Constitution is the name of Constantine’s wife)
Dialectical Materialism:	Have’s and Have Not’s
Disraeli:	Conservative Prime minister of the late 19 th century
Dreyfuss Affair:	Jewish Army officer accused of treason, proved not guilty, but who cares? He’s Jewish!
Duke of Wellington:	Rank of Peerage in the UK
Education Act of 1870:	Free elementary education for everybody! England
Emancipation of the Serfs:	Under Alexander II the Serfs were emancipated and given land+local government
Enclosure Act:	Denied the right to graze animals on certain areas of land
Expressionism:	Big, bold colors. Express deep dark emotions, Munch’s The Scream
Francis Joseph I:	Longest reigning European monarch, Austria
Frankfurt Assembly:	A bunch of crazies who thought they’d just get together and unite Germany on their lunch break. Tried to crown Friedrich Wilhelm IV.
